What an awesome achievement for our rangatahi!

It was wonderful to see so many of our whānau for our recent Hui Whāinga - thank you to all those who came to kōrero with their Whānau Group Kaiako. It is a wonderful opportunity for us to share with you, in an authentic way, how your rangatahi are progressing with their learning. Building relationships with you as whānau, and having a joint commitment to learning pathways and goals, is something that is powerful and we know it works.

We are busy finalising our new 'Phones Away During the Day' policy, which will come into effect day one of Term Two. We have talked at length with students and staff about how we will be implementing this government-led initiative. Exemptions for using a phone at school will only be allowed for very specific reasons, for example, if phones are used to monitor medical conditions. 
